School Home Plan

On behalf of the school's staff and Governors I would like to extend a warm welcome to you to Ysgol Terrig. The School Home Plan is a statutory contract that we are obliged to present to you as parents or guardians.

In a similar way to schools, parents/guardians have duties towards their children. We have set out the duties below and have included pledges made by the children themselves.

Parent or guardian pledges:

We are making every effort to:

- ensure punctual and regular attendance and to explain any absences; all long term absences require a Medical Certificate
- support high standards in terms of work and behaviour;
- ensure that the school has the latest contact information in case of an emergency;
- ensure that the school knows the end of day arrangements and who will collect the children from the school and to support the code of behaviour which ensures a safe, caring and disciplined environment;
- inform the school if there are any problems in my child's life that could affect his/her education;
- attend parent meetings to hear about my child's progress;
- support my child with his/her homework;
- support the school's social events;
- support every school policy.

The School's Pledges:

We will do our best to give you a warm welcome to the school and to give you every opportunity to play a part in your child's education. We promise to share information with you regularly about your child's progress and to inform you of any concerns that we have with regard to his/her education or behaviour. We will make every effort to give your child the best possible education, academically and socially.

The school will aim to:

- set high standards and offer the best possible education;
- encourage your child to reach his/her full potential in every aspect of school life;
- care for your child as a valuable member of the school community whatever his/her background, sex or religion;
- follow the code of behaviour that encourages a safe, caring and disciplined environment;
- offer a varied curriculum that fulfils everyone's needs;
- inform parents of any changes to the school's policies and share general information about the school's day to day life;
- extend a high standard of care to everyone involved with the school.

The Pupils' Pledges:

In order to ensure that the contract between my parents/guardians, my school and myself is a success, I must:

- regularly attend the school, be prepared to learn and to take part in school activities;
- co-operate with the staff and accept the school's authority and rules;
- do my best with regard to my work and not hinder others;
- consider the feelings and property of others within the school;
- care for the school, the building, land, furniture, equipment, books and any property on the school's grounds.
